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



To save his life when he was a toddler, doctors amputated both of Nate's legs below the knee, his left arm, several fingers on his right hand and part of his ear.

Meet Chloe, a busy sixteen-year-old who shares a rare genetic condition with her brother and sister. They were all born with Gitelman syndrome, in which the kidneys are unable to hold on to potassium and other electrolytes. It can cause severe muscle weakness and dangerous heart arrhythmias. It requires lifelong monitoring and treatment, but that isn't slowing down Chloe. In addition to dancing six days a week, she mentors younger ballerinas and is active in her school and church.


Daniela

Powering through a rare blood disorder

Meet Daniela, a resilient 7th grader and future nurse who lives with the daily challenges of beta thalassemia, a rare genetic blood disorder in which her body can't make healthy red blood cells. Treating it requires lifelong, regular blood transfusions, so for the past 11 years, Daniela has come to Connecticut Children's Infusion Center every three weeks. Living with beta thalassemia means living with fluctuating energy levels, but Daniela doesn't let that slow her down. She musters the energy to study lyrical dance and loves to cook.

Heart of a champion

Just days after Jordyn was born, doctors discovered a serious heart defect—pulmonary stenosis, a narrowing of the valve controlling blood flow to her lungs. Jordyn was rushed to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, where specialists at Connecticut Children’s performed a minimally invasive balloon procedure in the Catheterization Lab to open her valve. “They found it was 92 percent closed,” her mom Bethany recalls. “We were lucky they acted so quickly.” Today, Jordyn is a vibrant, active pre-teen who dances competitively, builds engineering projects, devours books, and advocates passionately for children’s health—living proof of the lifesaving care provided at Connecticut Children’s Heart Center.

Austin and Garrett

Twins who defied gravity

Born at 25 weeks, both boys endured heart surgery to repair birth defects as well as other medical emergencies that arose from being born premature. Garrett was ready to go home at 5 months, but scans showed Austin had a tumor on his liver. After brutal rounds of chemotherapy and surgery that removed 70% of his liver, Austin left the hospital after an extensive stay. Today, Austin is working through the challenges of cerebral palsy.

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
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
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Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

The most advanced care for our tiniest patients

Twins Kenny and Neema started life facing very long odds. Born prematurely at 23 weeks, Neema's estimated chance of survival was 26 percent, Kenny's only 13 percent. Each weighed just over a pound. They were rushed to Connecticut Children's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) in Hartford. As extremely preterm infants, they needed the highest level of care and technology.



Our NICU is consistently ranked by U.S. News & World Report as one of the best in the country, caring for the smallest and most vulnerable babies and providing a supportive, compassionate experience for families when they need it most. The reach of our 150 NICU professionals is vital and extraordinary: they staff 14 NICUs and newborn nurseries regionally and provide care to the majority of NICU babies in Connecticut.



Small enough to fit in the palm of their mother's hand

We work with babies born so early they are at the very edge of survivability. Their organs and systems are still in an early stage of development—development that was supposed to finish in the womb. Their lungs, hearts, digestive tracts and brains are nowhere near ready to deal with the world. They need highly specialized equipment and extraordinarily skilled medical staff, which is what they find in our



Hartford NICU. But our current NICU space is an open bay style, meaning constant light, sound, and movement in one open space. It's not ideal for babies ... or for families.

A child leaving the womb four months early with undeveloped organs and multiple life-threatening conditions deserves to have the best possible circumstances to grow and develop properly. And that means trying to recreate womb conditions: a place that is quiet, calm, controlled, and private. Clinical studies have shown that NICU babies may have better neurodevelopmental outcomes if they are in a private room. That is exactly what we are going to provide.

In our new tower, which will nearly double the clinical space of our flagship hospital in Hartford, we are adding over 50,000 square feet of NICU space over two floors. The new NICU will feature 50 beds in private rooms, with additional space to perform complex procedures at the baby's bedside. Just as important as the benefits for the babies, individual rooms give parents the privacy to deal with the immense emotional challenges of having their baby in such a delicate condition.
